### 5. Reporting requirements

TYPE OF REPORT ISSUED:	<b><i>Attestation de Vérification, Rapport d'Anomalies, Certification of final invoice.</i></b>
REPORT PURPOSE:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <i>Attestation de Verification is issued for the use of Customs Authorities and Importer for clearing the goods.</i></li> <li>• <i>Rapport d'Anomalies is issued for inconsistencies including quantity value and/or quality.</i></li> <li>• <i>A certified final invoice is given to the exporter for L/C transactions or upon request.</i></li> </ul>

### 6. Inspection fees

*Paid by the importer (to the Bank when opening the DIC).*

*Nevertheless, Bureau Veritas/BIVAC may invoice the Seller in the event of supplementary inspection visits (in vain or unsatisfactory results). The costs incurred by the Seller in presenting the goods for inspection, such as unpacking, handling, testing, sampling, repacking... are for the account of the Seller.*

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## 7. List of goods exempted from PSI

- Precious stones;
- Precious metals;
- Objects of art;
- Ammunitions and arms other than for hunting and/or sport, similar materials and equipment imported by Army itself;
- Live animals;
- Cinematographic films, exposed and developed;
- Current newspapers and periodicals;
- Parcel post;
- Medicines;
- Imports for United Nations Organisations, for their own use;
- Goods imported for which the FOB value is below XAF 500,000.

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## 8. List of prohibited goods

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## 9. List of restricted goods

- Sugar: any request for a DIC is subject to the submission by the importer of the original of the inter-departmental authorisation granted for importing sugar in the Central African Republic.
